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#### 1. Introduction

#### 1.1 PURPOSE

The information detailed in this AOI has been generated to confirm the requirements and advise the procedures for the issue and governance of the Airport documentation, relating to the safety of operations.

## 2. GOVERNANCE

### 2.1 RESPONSIBILITY

It is incumbent on all recipient organisations, to disseminate information contained in Airport publications to their staff; and where appropriate, to their sub-tenants. This requirement applies to all issued Airport Operational Instructions (AOIs), Operational Works & Safety Instructions (OWSIs) and Security Notices (SNs), as relevant.

#### 2.2 ASSURANCE

The Civil Aviation Authority requires assurance from the Airport Certificate holder that they ensure safe practices prevail throughout the Operational area of the Airport and to this end, the Airport requires all Airport users, tenants and sub-tenants to carry out their activities in accordance with Civil Aviation Authority and Health & Safety guidelines.

#### 2.3 COMPLIANCE

In order to comply with the CAA requirements, the Airport Authority reserves the right to audit the Health & Safety practices of all persons or organisations using the Airport. This audit process may take the form of pre-notified visits to determine the existence of Health & Safety Policy documents and regulatory Airport documents; plus, compliance with safe standards of working that are in accordance with statutory requirements and where applicable, Airport Authority standards.
